



#### **Talent Pipeline**

Southern Arizona provides a continually growing and diverse workforce that is sustained through a K-12 system that works closely with the Pima Community College, University of Arizona, Arizona State University and other higher education institutions throughout the state to ensure students are prepared to enter the workforce.

#### K-12 | Career and Technical Education

The Tucson Metro area is home to several K-12 schools that were ranked among the **Top 20 schools** in the country by U.S. News & World Report in 2024. These schools are consistently ranked among the best year after year. Additionally, the Pima Joint Technical Education District (JTED) provides tuition-free career and technical education (CTE) to high school students. Business and industry partnerships create opportunities for students to work alongside professionals through paid internships, job shadowing, and unique Master Classes with the goal to create a qualified skilled workforce for the region. JTED operates the Innovative Learning Campus, which offers industry training in disciplines including cybersecurity, mechatronics, information technology, and more in a **50,000-square-foot** "collaborative" learning space.

## STATE INCENTIVES

## **ARIZONA: THE BEST STATE FOR BUSINESS**

#### **Quality Jobs Tax Credit**

Provides up to \$9,000 of income or premium tax credits over a three-year period for each net new job to the state and concurrent qualifying capital expenditures.

#### **Qualified Facility Tax Credit**

Provides **refundable income tax credits up to \$30,000** per qualifying net new job to eligible manufacturing companies that invest in one or more qualifying facilities.

#### **Additional Depreciation**

Accelerates depreciation to substantially reduce business personal property taxes.

#### **Exemption for Machinery and Equipment & Electricity**

Provides Transaction Privilege Tax (sales tax) and Use Tax exemptions.

#### **Research & Development Tax Credit**

Provides an Arizona income tax credit for increased research and development activities conducted in this state. The R&D tax credit is equal to **24% of the first \$2.5 million in qualifying expenses, plus 15% of the qualifying expenses in excess of \$2.5 million.** As of 2023, tax credit rates changed to 20% of the first \$2.5 million in qualifying expenses plus 11% of the qualifying expenses in excess of \$2.5 million.

#### **Property Tax Reduction of 90%**

In March 2022, Governor Ducey signed into law HB 2822, legislation that substantially **lowers business personal property tax liability by 90% or more**. The bill also dramatically simplifies the personal property tax structure and reduces burdens on business owners.

## LOCAL INCENTIVES

## **TUCSON: GROWING BUSINESS**

#### City of Tucson: Primary Jobs Incentive Program

The incentive provides up to a 100% reimbursement of construction sales tax to qualifying expenses such as the project's public infrastructure improvements, offsets to impact fees, and/or jobtraining. The City may also reimburse eligible building permit fees.

#### **City of Tucson: Government Property Lease Excise Tax (GPLET)**

The GPLET program provides eligible projects up to eight years of property tax abatement. This incentive is available for projects located in the Central Business District that result in a property value increase of at least 100%.

#### Foreign Trade Zone

Any property in Pima County and Southern Pinal County can be designated and activated as a Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ). This allows companies to reduce costs from customs duties, taxes and tariffs, improve global market competitiveness, and minimize bureaucratic regulations.

#### Rio Nuevo Tax Increment Finance District

Rio Nuevo is the only tax increment finance district (TIF) in the state of Arizona. In partnership with developers, investors and lenders, Rio Nuevo invests in projects designed to expand the tax base and bring patrons and new businesses to Downtown Tucson. Rio Nuevo helps defray the steep costs of major new development and property improvements.

#### **Town of Marana: Job Creation Incentive Program**

Helps businesses to locate or expand in Marana by receiving reimbursement from reallocation of construction sales tax on new construction or expansion projects to qualifying employers.

#### **Town of Oro Valley: Primary Employer Incentive Program**

Helps businesses to locate or expand in Oro Valley by reallocating construction sales tax revenues on new construction or expansion projects to expenses like employee relocation expenses, job training, public infrastructure, or impact fee offsets.





## **RAIL & INTERMODAL SHIPPING**

The Port of Tucson, the region's intermodal facility, is located directly on the Union Pacific main line and provides international ocean container rail service to and from seaports in California and Mexico.

This allows companies to avoid delays at the Port of Los Angeles and Port of Long Beach and take advantage of lower freight costs by over-the-road transportation.

## **URBAN ENERGY & CULTURE**

Tucson has a variety of urban offerings, drawing in attractions to suit every need. The community's strong support has aided in the continued development of downtown. Since 2008, Downtown Tucson has experienced more than \$1.2 billion in public and private investments, with an additional half billion dollars being invested into current and proposed projects.

#### **Tucson Meet Yourself**

An annual celebration of the living traditional arts of Southern Arizona's and Northern Mexico's diverse ethnic and folk communities. The free, three-day event features hundreds of artisans, home cooks, dancers, musicians and special exhibits that celebrate and honor beauty in all its diverse, informal and everyday forms.

#### **1st U.S. City of Gastronomy**

Selected in 2015 by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

#### **Tucson Gem & Mineral Show**

The Tucson Gem and Mineral Show® attracts 65,000 attendees and has included exhibits from the Smithsonian Institution and the Carnegie Museum of Natural History.

#### **Festivals & Events**

Tucson boasts **over 200 festivals and events**; it is one of the nine cities worldwide honored as a **2017 World Festival & Event City**.

#### 1-Hour From Wine Country

Known as Arizona's wine country, **Sonoita**, was Arizona's first (and one of the first in the U.S.) to have earned the **American Viticultural Area** (**AVA**) designation, thanks to its rolling hills and cooler temperatures. This region is home to about 20 wineries —not to mention impressive views.

**Hiking** 

Tucson offers some of the Southwest's most breathtaking hiking experiences, with trails for every skill level. Among the most memorable are the stunning waterfall hikes—Seven Falls in Sabino Canyon rewards hikers with cascading pools nestled in canyon walls, while Tanque Verde Falls showcases dramatic desert scenery and cool mountain runoff. These iconic hikes, along

with hundreds of miles of additional trails, make Tucson an unmatched destination for outdoor enthusiasts seeking adventure, relaxation and year-round sunshine.

#### Cycling

Bike-friendly streets and awesome off-road trails make Tucson one of Bicycling Magazine's top cycling destinations and the #2 Bike-Friendly City in the U.S. by Livability.com.

#### **Plants & Animals**

Tucson is surrounded by desert, but did you know the area has seven of the world's nine "life zones," including grasslands and alpine forest?

#### The Chuck Huckelberry Loop

The Loop is an urban trail system made up of 131 miles of paved bike lanes and trails. You can enter The Loop at any designated point; closed to motorized vehicles, which allows greater freedom for cyclists, pedestrians, and equestrians to roam.
